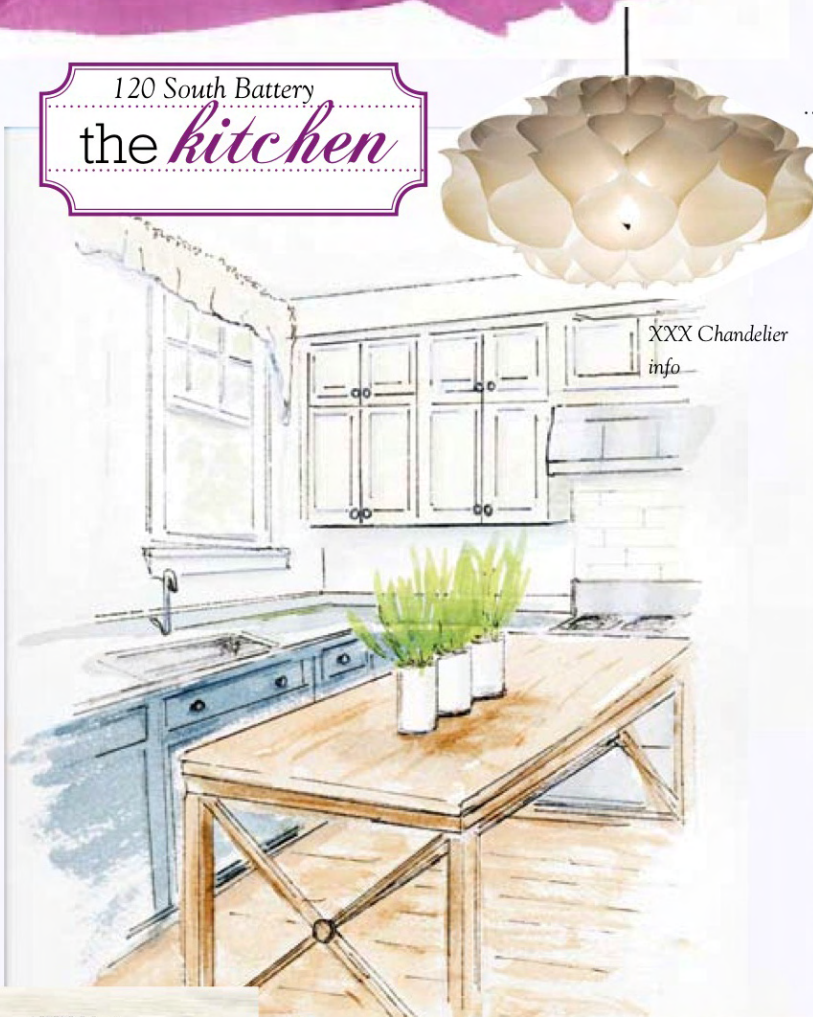

kitchen cheat sheet

1. By painting the lower cabinets grey, Gaylord allows the existing black countertops to blend in, rather than dominate the room.
2. A large picture frame hung over oversized picture window gives a visual break from the expanse of glass without interfering with the view.
3. The custom island was designed to be open underneath to keep it from closing off open space.

Working with the existing cabinetry and countertop, kitchen designer **Sandra Gaylord** "set out to make something old new again," she explains. Gaylord repainted the cabinetry using two different hues for upper and lower cupboards (crisp white and pewter-grey, respectively). Lacking a natural breakfast area, she added an open, freestanding island which provides a much-needed spot for eating and conversation.

After working in Washington, D.C., for several years, Gaylord returned to her native Charleston to open Gaylord Design, LLC. She is a Certified Kitchen Designer and Allied member of ASID, specializing in residential, kitchen, and hospitality design.
